HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

The new 2011-12 Sonoma County Homeless Resource Guide lists free and low cost services to help those struggling with homelessness to find shelter, food, health care, financial assistance, permanent housing, employment, disability services, and more. To ensure that this new edition is complete and easy to use, we referred to the last edition of this guide and others, service agencies and websites, and 211's site (www.211wc.org).

Each section focuses on an area of need: alcohol & drug recovery, mental health care, food (emergency groceries and meals), emergency shelter, permanent, supportive or transitional housing, disability services, employment and training, legal assistance, transportation, etc. Listings are arranged geographically, with agencies that serve all of Sonoma County listed first. We've included street addresses when walk-in services are available and omitted them when people are asked to call for an intake appointment or get on a waiting list.

Many agencies offer multiple services. Rather than duplicate information, we refer you to the section with additional listings for that agency. The Guide includes web addresses for the first time, and email addresses for staff members who respond to inquiries. We've also indicated whether Spanish and other languages are spoken.
